OUR EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY

Baton Rouge College Prep is founded on the belief that all students can achieve at high levels. Our school design is grounded in eight core principles, based on the proven practices of the highest performing charter schools in the nation. Each month we will highlight one of the core principles and explain how it promotes student success. This month, we highlight the sixth core principle:

- 1) High academic expectations for all
- 2) Great teachers, great results
- 3) Highly structured environment
- 4) Focused character

development

- 5) Data-driven culture
- 6) Extended learning time
- 7) Seamless grade transitions
- 8) Family involvement

Extended Learning Time

Baton Rouge College Prep will operate on an extended day (7:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.) and annual calendar (182 days) to capitalize on learning opportunities and ensure that students are operating at and above grade level as quickly as possible. Student achievement improves when schools have more time to do what matters most.

By adding more time for students to learn, we will create the opportunity to focus intensely and strategically on literacy and math. Students will have more time for each content



area, allowing time for mastering skills that may have been missed and to enhance skills already mastered. In our early middle school grades, every day we will provide three hours for literacy and two hours for mathematics.

We know that many students will require supports beyond our multiple blocks of literacy and math. Our longer school day will allow for daily targeted interventions for all students, while the longer school year will ensure that students have the necessary time to develop proficiency in and mastery of rigorous, Common Core-aligned subject matter.

Our teachers will also have more time for professional learning and data-driven action. Three and a half weeks of professional development each summer will lay the foundation for each school year. Every day, teachers will have common planning time with grade level and content teammates. Each Friday, students will be released at 2:30 p.m., allowing teachers two and a half hours of professional development time. Every year, six professional development days give teachers time to develop action plans in response to student data.

OUR PROGRESS

- Our Board is preparing for governance while waiting for the final authorization decision from the Louisiana Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, expected in August. Look for our website and social media, coming soon!
